



## Bruno & Sons Violin

A handsome and characterful late 19th-century violin, historically sold through the New York firm of C. Bruno & Son, showing strong Central European and Northern Italian stylistic influence. While the exact origin remains open to interpretation, the instrument possesses a distinctly individual hand-made quality that sets it apart from ordinary commercial trade production of the period.

The violin is attractively constructed on a refined model with a beautifully figured one-piece maple back of medium flame and warm amber-brown varnish exhibiting natural texture and wear consistent with age and use. The scroll is confidently carved with restrained elegance, and the f-holes display an individual, expressive placement that contributes greatly to the instrument's personality and visual appeal.



Most impressive is the violin's tonal character. The sound is notably large, dark, and mature, with a broad lower register, strong projection, and a warm, resonant core. Under the bow the instrument responds generously, producing a rich and atmospheric voice that is highly satisfying for solo, chamber, or orchestral playing alike. Rather than the brighter and more polished character often encountered in workshop instruments, this violin offers depth, warmth, and complexity more commonly associated with older hand-crafted European instruments.

An unusually rewarding and musically compelling violin with genuine individuality, strong tonal presence, and considerable artistic charm.



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
